and lettering we are familiar with. What Mike sent is exactly what I asked for: the shield and lettering without any vinyl between the shield and lettering. In addition to the original design request, he also sent some round decals showing the same lettering and shield design on a white vinyl background. The original shield/Inland Mopars lettering design decal is 3.88" x 5.88", the round decals are either 3.50" or 5.68" in diameter. All are designed for exterior mounting and made from a very high-quality vinyl with a clear UV protective coating. Mike said they should easily last 7-10 years. You need to come to the club meetings to see them and help decide what design we like best.

Lastly, please let Mike Keller know if you will be attending Spring Fling at Woodley Park in Van Nuys on April 23-24. The club can use some help in distributing our "Mopars in May at CSDR" show flyers to all of the participants.
