Wings 'n' Things May 6 meeting will once again be at the Cactus Cantina

Maybe it's just my imagination, but maybe there really is more interest in Mopars from the automotive magazine world. Of course, we expect nothing but Mopar coverage in *Mopar Action, Mopar Collector's Guide* and *Mopar Muscle*, but I've seen a recent uptick in Mopar coverage in *Hemmings Muscle Machines*. If you're not familiar with *HMM* pick up a copy and take a look. It will bring back a lot of memories and reacquaint you with some of the strong street runners that you may have forgotten about as the magazine covers all brands. The magazine subtitle says it is "The Ultimate All-American Performance Car Magazine". In addition to the increased Mopar coverage they also have a couple of columnists that appear to be fairly Mopar-centered.

The February 2018 issue cover featured a 1971 Hemi Charger R/T and a six-page feature article on what the magazine called "HEMI's Last Hurrah", as 1971 was the final year of the 426 Hemi availability in production vehicles.

The recent June 2018 issue cover shows a 1969 Dodge Daytona and inside covers the restoration of the severely dilapidated project that was originally picked up in 1984 for \$1500 and a small block Chevy engine. This article is 'Part 1' and promises 'Part 2: A 1969 Daytona Soars Again' in the upcoming July issue

HMM is more oriented toward factory restorations than modifications and features some great photos, if you're looking for reference on correct interiors and under hood areas. Each issue also features a fun "Muscle Car Scrapbook" where owners tell stories from their early muscle car ownership.

Pick up a copy and take a look.

Those of us that are drag racing fans all seem to agree that Pro Stock has lost its appeal since it seems to have turned into "Pro Camaro" - the current NHRA event entries consist of 17 Camaros and a single Dodge Dart. The class struggles to consistently field a full 16car ladder.

It seems many fans wouldn't be sad to see Pro Stock go away and the usually suggested replacement seems to be the fairly new Factory Stock class that is made up of current production "modern muscle" Dodge Challengers, Chevrolet Camaros and Ford Mustangs. Competition like this is reminiscent of the old "Win on Sunday, Sell on Monday" marketing from back in the late '60s and early '70s.

What is interesting is how the class participation is so similar to what we find at open car shows. 




