2019 Is Going To Be Special

We received confirmation that the twelve spots have been reserved for us so all we need to do now is decide which twelve club member cars are going to be displayed.

We have several cars currently under construction and heading to a last-minute push to completion so they will be ready to make their debut. The cutoff date for turning in the Vehicle Entry Forms is November 1, 2018. I contacted the show producer, Rod Shows, to see if it might be possible to turn in the Vehicle Entry Forms and then supply their required pictures later - just in case some of those under construction rides might not be photogenic in time. They advised the photos are only for the show program, so if any of you aren't interested in seeing your car in the show program, then you do not have to supply the required photos. In order to make sure we get in, please have your completed Vehicle Entry Form ready to turn in no later than our October club meeting at the Ontario Elks Car Show on October 7. Bring it to the club meeting together with the required photos: front quarter view, rear quarter view, interior and engine compartment, and your check or Money Order in the amount of \$150 made out to "Rod Shows". All GNRS entries will be mailed together.


Toy Drive for Ft. Irwin Quick Update (August)



Jennifer Caputo-Armstrong Races to Quarter-Finals in Fontana

Jennifer Caputo-Armstrong raced to the fourth round in her first weekend of racing in the NHRA Summit Series Pro class at Auto Club Drag way in Fontana, California. In the Saturday race, her first ever Summit Series race, Jennifer advanced to the second round in her Liquid Glow Racing Magnuson supercharged 426ci Arrington Performance powered 2007 Dodge Magnum.

In an event filled day, Jennifer improved on that in the Sunday race advancing to the final seven cars in the quarter-finals before bowing out.

"This was Jen's third time driving the car in competition," said crew chief (and editor-publisher of MoparMax.com) Richard Kratz. "She's developing at a very rapid rate as a drag racer. NHRA's Summit Series is known for tough competition at participating tracks across the country. There are no easy wins in this series; the best local racers are your competition. The car was very consistent on Saturday and Jen drove really well. In the second round she learned an important lesson about just how hard it is psychologically for a driver to give up the stripe in a close race."



"Another weekend of firsts for me," said Jennifer. "My very first NHRA race and I collected my first NHRA points. There's always room for improvement and this weekend I learned how hard it is to give up the stripe. At the last moment I knew I wasn't gonna beat the car I was racing but instead of lifting I stayed in the throttle and it cost me the race. Good part is I now know how this scenario feels. The next time I'm in that predicament I'll be better equipped to make the proper judgement."



On Sunday, the car was right on the predictions in the first time trial but, in the second time trial the supercharger belt broke. That belt also drives the water pump, so the car overheated as well as suffering the belt breakage.

"When we got the car back to the pits, we had to fix everything to make the first round," said Richard. "Two years ago, Magnuson engineered, built and installed a new two-belt arrangement for our car that dramatically shortened the supercharger belt length. Also, American Racing Solutions provided one of their amazing billet HEMI race belt tensioners. Together, we eliminated the frequent belt breakage problems we used to have. We weren't sure what the life cycle was on the new belt, but we do now. We just learned it the hard way!"

Working in tight confines on a hot engine it was touch and go to get the repairs done in time for the first round. Liquid Glow Racing would like to thank Pat Van Dusen and his friend Ricky for pitching in and helping them get to the second round.

"Maggi has been such a solid partner so when her belt broke it was a chance to see how the team worked together under pressure," said Jennifer. "They made first call to lanes for my class and we had not yet gotten her fixed. I was confident we would make the next round but had also mentally accepted we might not. Everyone kept their cool and continued working together as fast as they could. It takes me awhile to get settled in my belts and hooked up to the radio and I realized me standing around watching the team work on Maggi was doing no good so I got myself dressed, belted in, hooked up to the radio and sat patiently waiting for the team to let me know we were ready to head to the lanes. Pat Van Dusen and his friend Ricky were unfortunately done for the day due to a leaky fuel pump so they came over to our pit to lend a hand. I remember Ricky leaning in the window as he saw me getting ready and said 'a little anxious are we?' I replied that I didn't want to be the one we were waiting on when it was time to go. The team got the job done in the nick of time and we were off. Fortunately I won the round but when we got back to the pits we realized that because Maggi had overheated, there were bubbles in the coolant system...this set into motion yet another chance for the team to work under pressure. It was another down to the wire experience but we made it to the lanes in time. Thanks a bunch to Richard, Andy, Fender, Pat Van Dusen and Ricky. Because of all of you we were not only a success at racing but a shining example of teamwork and helping your fellow racer."



The team is very happy with the results of the race. The car gets more consistent with every round and Jennifer gets better with every pass she makes. Challenger 2 - Bonneville Speed Week 2018



Mopar Power Gives 50-year old Challenger 2 the Piston-Powered Land Speed Record

50 years after Mickey Thompson's original 406 mph run with the Challenger 2, his son Danny Thompson took the Challenger 2 from storage and began the extensive process of restoring, retrofitting, and updating the vehicle to complete the goal the car was unable to achieve back in 1968 - setting a new piston-driven world land speed record. Bad weather and mechanical problems scuttled earlier attempts, but Danny and his team were back at Speed Week on Bonneville, Utah's Salt Flats, a couple of weeks ago for another shot at the record, with 435mph as the target. And they blew by that with ease.





Two years ago, Danny set the overall AA/FS record at 406.769 mph, but on the first day of 2018 Speed Week the Challenger 2 laid down a mind-numbing 446.605 mph pass - with a broken valve spring. The crew got everything repaired for an attempt at a back-up run on Sunday to confirm a new record. And a new record it was as Danny recorded 450.909 mph for the five-mile run to secure his family's name in the record books. The new official record, which is an average of the two runs, is 448.757 mph.

Rather than the original Ford 427s, the restored Challenger 2 is powered by a pair of dry-block nitro-fueled Hemi V8 engines in an all-wheel drive configuration. Overall horsepower has more than

doubled, going from 600 front engine and 1200 rear engine to an even 2500 per. Twin three-speed gearboxes link the two engines together and counterbalance output, a marked improvement over the original "split gas pedal and Mickey's intuition" mechanism. The front of the car houses two 30 gallon aluminum fuel tanks that hold just enough nitromethane for one full speed pass. The total curb weight approaches 5200 lbs.






