As you are aware, the current COVID-19 pandemic has essentially shut down almost all car show related activities. This has severely affected our annual Fort Irwin Toy Drive efforts since without car shows we cannot have our Toy Drive booth at various shows and be able to collect toys. So, here is what we are planning:

- 1. November 28, 2020 The Saturday of Thanksgiving weekend will be our 1st Annual Fort Irwin Cruise and Poker Run. Mike Keller is planning this in conjunction with a local SoCal DJ who has put on other similar events. This type of event will allow SoCal car enthusiasts to get out of the house and drive their cars while still maintaining social distancing. # Because He Could - 1971 Plymouth Duster

There is more than one way to push a 1971 Plymouth Duster into the 10s By David Conwill from November 2016 issue of Muscle Machines



When Plymouth moved the Barracuda from the A-body platform, shared with Valiant, to the new E-body platform, shared with the Dodge Challenger, for 1970, it still wanted a sporty economy car to fill the gap. The Duster was that car, and like the original Barracuda it offered aggressive looks and a whole range of powertrains at a working man's price--from a 198-cu.in. Slant Six to a 340-cu.in. V-8 with the buyer's choice of three- or four-speed manual or TorqueFlite automatic.

Steve Nitti purchased this 1971 Duster in January of 1972 as a leftover on a dealer's lot on his 19th birthday. "I was sick of borrowing my dad's rusty four-door Buick," he says with a laugh. "I bought a Slant Six and an automatic because it was easier on gas and easier on insurance--more money to spend on dates." He paid \$2,200 on a \$2,800 sticker price, and for his money also got a rubber floor covering and an AM radio.

Those dates went well enough that he courted his now-wife in the car, and they kept it as their daily driver for 15 years, even bringing their son home from the hospital in it. When its service life was through, Steve set the Duster aside as a future project.

Before he could get started on the Duster, he decided to restore a rare 1966 Barracuda Formula S that he had. When the Barracuda was about halfway finished, he gave the green light to SharaDon Performance in Hugo, Minnesota, to start on the Duster. "I told them I wanted the car to run in the 10s," he says. The shop knew he had a few Hemi engines salted away and assumed he meant to install one of those, but no, those were an investment. "I wanted to be in the 10s with a Slant Six. They did the homework."

Unsurprisingly, pushing a Slant Six Duster down the drag strip that quickly involves a favorable power-to-weight ratio. But this is no pure drag machine, so weight savings had to be balanced against creature comforts. The Duster lacks things like windshield wipers and a heater, but does have a stereo "so I can listen to the Beatles," Steve says.

Other weight-loss areas include Wilwood disc brakes in place of the cast-iron drums, a fiberglass hood and front bumper, tubular front suspension, rack-and-pinion steering and an aluminum radiator. At the track, Steve swaps out the factory bucket seats and street wheels and tires for a Kirkey racing seat and a set of lightweight wheels with racing tires. "I think all four racing tires may be as heavy as one of the rear street tires," he says.

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With the car doing its best Feather Duster impression at around 2,850 pounds dressed for the strip, it was time to address the power. The Slant Six, originally a 95-hp 225 (a 1975 block was selected for its nickel content) and now displacing 262.5 cubic inches, makes 505.2 horsepower and 519.5 pound-feet of torque. Hot rodding the Slant Six is already a well-honed art with some folks. It started way back with the Valiants that dominated the short-lived NASCAR Compact Class back in 1960, but 350 horsepower is a far more common output from the so-called "Leaning Tower of Power."

To accomplish this almost magical result, Steve and the folks at SharaDon went beyond carburetors and ram induction to the latest and greatest: EFI with a FAST brain, ProCharger centrifugal supercharging and water injection. The valves are from the latest generation of Hemi V-8s and an electric water pump was necessary due to the supercharger belt, though doubtless it doesn't hurt to shed some parasitic loss. A 1971 head was also ported and relieved to make things flow. Making the power was almost the easy part; just as much work went into making the engine last.

The Slant Six has an almost legendary reputation for durability in stock form, which is one of the reasons folks use them as a basis for hot rods to begin with. But with 500+ horsepower on tap, Steve needed to go even further: beehive valve springs, mastic cement to stabilize the bottom 1/3 of the cylinder block and a heavily upgraded oil system, for starters. Steve and SharaDon also adapted 440 V-8 billet main caps to the bottom end of the engine to create what Steve terms "one heck of a good cradle" for the crankshaft.

All this power goes to the ground via a custom-built TorqueFlite automatic, based on the car's original transmission case, with a reverse-manual valve body and an 8¾-inch rear axle with welded-on reinforcements. The car also looks great thanks to a repaint in the original Gold Metallic Leaf color along with Duster 340-inspired side stripes and "225" callouts on the flanks.

The end result is most impressive. On the car's first outing, it ran 12.01 seconds at 98 MPH. From there, Steve says, "it just kept getting better and better." Aided by data logging, Steve kept improving the car's performance until it finally ran a best of 10.84 seconds at 122 MPH. The car consistently runs in the low 11s and Steve is hoping to do even better soon with a smaller-diameter supercharger pulley and swapping the Slant Six flexplate for a heavy-duty 340 V-8 item.

There is always somebody quicker, of course. That's just a fact of racing. But there's a certain pride to be taken in simply doing the best with what you have. This is a Slant Six, overlooked by the mainstream, taken up to and beyond its natural limits. The result, Steve says with a touch of well-earned pride, "Usually lifts one wheel off the ground, sometimes two. Which is really neat for a six."

(Editors comment: I know Steve & have seen his '66 Barracuda back in Minnesota. A beautiful car. I have also raced Steve & his Duster at MATS a few years ago. He is a great guy & a great competitor. He hauled out from Minnesota & brought the owner of SharaDon out as his pit crew. One of these days I will see him again at the Midwest Mopars' Mopars in the Park car show.)

Today we learned: AMC nearly called a car the Hellcat




Since FCA introduced the <u>Hellcat</u> performance trim for the long-lived third-generation Hemi--and especially since it introduced the crate version a couple years back--bench racers have envisioned dropping Hellcats into all sorts of vehicles and have taken a particular and perverse delight in envisioning Hellcat-powered AMC products, similar to that Ringbrothers-built Javelin from a few years back.

But, as we learned while perusing Patrick Foster's "American Motors Corporation: The Rise and Fall of America's Last Independent Automaker," AMC had a Hellcat project of its own long before FCA decided to use that name. According to Foster, AMC's Hellcat was a "mock-up of a possible sporty car to replace the Javelin and AMX later in the decade." He doesn't provide a date for the clay model, but the 401 badge suggests that it was photographed sometime before AMC's designers knew that the company wouldn't put 401s in cars after 1974. We're guessing at least a couple years prior, possibly around the time Dodge marketed the original Demon.

While we'd have expected to see at least some of the clay Hellcat's design language in the <u>circa-1968 second-generation Javelin clay model photos</u>, this version appears shorter, more like a half-step between the Seventies Javelin/AMXs and the later Spirit liftback. In fact, that door shape looks rather like the Spirit's/Gremlin's/Hornet's.

And while we'd of course like to find out more about this design, we're also intrigued by everything going on in the background. From far right, there's some sort of Gremlin, a full-size drawing of a rather long station wagon, and at least a couple smaller renderings of a front-engine, rear-wheel-drive minivan. Curiously, if our stab at the date of the photo above is correct, then that's about the same time Ford designers were hard at work on its Carousel minivan project.



Bonus, on the same page as the above photograph, Foster also included another example of AMC choosing a name that another company later put into production. According to Foster, the Amigo "was an early proposal for what became the 1975 Pacer." Judging from the limited space ahead of the cowl, AMC still wanted to power the Amigo/Pacer with a rotary at this time.



Unearthing a Time-Forgotten Fleet of Rare Muscle Cars Stephan Szantai Writer, Photographer Aug 14, 2020



Check out this exceptional find, recently exhumed in Tucson, Arizona. This "Fab Five" belonged to Mark Spear, a gearhead with a taste for muscle cars, who passed away last April at the age of 71. His love of cars came from his father who worked at a local Ford dealership in Minneapolis, Minnesota. When Mark turned 21 in 1970, the elder Spear turned his son on to quite a bargain.

A customer had traded in a <u>'68 Shelby GT500 KR</u>, a soon-to-become iconic Mustang equipped with a stout 428 ci V8. The KR (which stands for "King of the Road") was rated at 335 hp, although later independent tests reported that the engine made well over 400 hp. Mark had to have it and so started a lifelong journey with the four-speed car, one of a little over 1,000 Fastback KRs ever built. He paid \$2.119.67 for it.



During the years that followed, he became a military man as well as an engineer, and met the love of his life, Ann. Speed and adrenaline played key roles in his life as an Air Force helicopter pilot, so it's no surprise he later found himself collecting American muscle cars. He turned into a local legend for his fight to save the breed, to keep his personal vehicles; yet, he also battled the outside sources of the world that made muscle car ownership more difficult. His involvement with local politics led him to consider running for congress at one point. In 2016, the U.S. House of Representatives recognized Mark for his outstanding community service in southern Arizona.



During the oil crisis of the 1970s, Mark seized the opportunity to buy the gas-guzzlers seen in these pictures. Plenty examples were for sale at the time—cheap. He could finally purchase the dream machines he longed for, starting with a \$450 '69 Dodge Charger 500 and a \$2,000 four-speed '71 Dodge Challenger with a 426ci Hemi. Then came a four-speed '70 Dodge Coronet R/T with a 440ci Six-Pack, followed by a '69 Charger R/T 440, a "parts car" bought at a bargain price. This Mopar family of four joined his '68 Shelby G.T. 500KR. All have survived as demonstrated by the photos from this article.

Mark and Ann enjoyed the local car scene with their rides, making many friends along the way. When moving to Tucson, Arizona, a number of years later, the vehicles all came with them, some hooked to tow bars (the Challenger and the Coronet), the rest on trailers. The Spears loved to travel, enjoying many ocean cruises, but Mark was also happy to share his amazing machines at home when the opportunity ever arose to talk nuts 'n' bolts. He remained a member of local and national car clubs for years, while continuing to collect parts and literature to fuel his passion.

Mark categorically refused to sell his muscle cars during his decades of ownership. Though rare and nearly new when he acquired them, they slowly fell into disrepair. The Charger 500 shared the main garage's space with tons of electronics and inventory from his business; the other rides rested in the backyard under the harsh Arizona sun. For years, the Hemi Challenger sat in the driveway, attracting a steady stream of notes on the windshield and knocks at the door. All were turned away.



The very few people who knew about the Mustang and Mopars lurking on the property would occasionally pester Mark to sell, but the answer was always no. As Mark started battling health issues, several of his car buddies met to discuss his vehicles and the best way to help Ann with them, as the inevitable approached. Mark Spear passed away on April 29, 2020.

One of his longtime mechanics and gearhead friend, Gary Taylor, took the initiative to help Ann in her time of need, knowing that the vultures would start circling and trying to pluck the jewels from the property. Gary additionally stepped up to assist with the monumental task of sorting through Mark's lifetime of collecting. They made the wise decision of soliciting some professional help, ultimately entrusting Randy Carlson of Carchaeology. Incidentally, you might recognize him as one of the appraisers on the MotorTrend App's *Sticker Shock* show (btw, check out the MotorTrend App's Summer Deal and start streaming great automotive videos today!) Randy agreed to inspect, appraise, and prepare the cars for the market.

Later, an 18-wheel hauler traveled to Tucson and, one by one, the five vehicles were pulled from the yard and carefully loaded for their trip to California. "The car carrier rolling across the desert, loaded with sun burnt and dusty muscle cars, caused quite a stir," Randy said. "Photos and videos were taken and shared online all along the path. The driver arrived here with a stack of business cards and phone numbers of people interested in buying the cars."

As the time of this writing, the Mopars and the Shelby are being thoroughly inspected as well as documented at Carchaeology's "lab," in preparation for their sale. Hopefully, engines will roar and wheels will roll soon, the goal being to find the perfect home with other enthusiasts.

Cheers to Major Mark Spear and his dedication to his V8-powered machines. Thank you for your service and for being the caretaker of these hidden jewels. Now, let's all share in the fun of their discovery and revival
