## Down Under Charger submitted by Martin Hubbard, Inland Mopars member

First a little back ground; I realize that American muscle cars are not so common these days but during their time they were plentiful and not difficult to acquire in the USA. However, over here in Australia, all we got were poor substitutes. We had 4 door Falcon GTs starting with 289s in '66 and ending with 351 GTHO doing 14.4 ETs. GM had the 2 door Monaro with similar specs running 327 and 350 Chevs, but Chrysler had very little to offer. The first performance car in '69 was not only too late on the scene, it was a 4 door Dart based Valiant using the Road Runner concept of a stripped down performer and the 3 speed manual 175bhp 225 Slant. It was nothing to rave about against the V8s. Ultimately in 1972, we saw the iconic 302bhp E49 version of the 265 Hemi straight six Valiant Charger with 13.3 ETs.

Meanwhile, like a lot of Aussies, I dreamed of owning a US muscle car. So in 1971 when a local dealer imported and converted a '70 R/T Dodge Charger, I was smitten. It sold for a whopping \$11,000 AUD when a family sedan was around \$2500. Over time I saw photos of the '70 Charger's even prettier '69 sibling. Problem was that when you added up shipping, tax, customs and RHD conversion these cars were out of reach for someone like me. It took giving up cigarettes in 1989 to finance a car and even then, it had to be a project. Back then it cost around \$4,000 minimum in shipping from LA and we paid 35% Customs Duty on the landed cost and then 30% Sales Tax on the total. New cars cost 130% customs! These days old cars have no customs duty and the Sales tax is now reduced to just 10% with the change to GST. My \$3500 USD Signet last year only owes me \$11,300 AUD in my driveway. Not much when you say it fast. You can just imagine the cost of a mint '69 R/T Charger back in the day, particularly after an expensive RHD conversion. In LA in 1991 you could buy a Lexus ES400 for \$21,000 but in Australia the same car RHD cost exactly \$100,000 more! My current daily driver is a low mileage S500 Benz that some fool bought new for \$347,000!!!!! I paid only \$36,000.

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Enter my almost poverty pack 1969 Dodge Charger. It rolled off the production line quite late in the model year at the Hamtramck plant in Detroit on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of July 1969. It sold new from Reseda Dodge Los Angeles a whole 5 months later in December '69. I still don't quite understand for sure why the delay. Given that it had some unusual options for a base model car, I would have thought that these optioned up cars were usually customer specified but July to December seems a long lead time. Particularly when by then it was sold it was a superseded model. Maybe it was a showroom special?









Anyway it began as a base model 318 V8 & 904 auto. It was mid bronze (I believe T3) with a black vinyl roof and a tan interior. The options were A/C, Floor Shift and Console, Manual 6 way driver's seat adjuster, map pocket door cards, Hood mounted indicator repeaters and Power Disc Brakes with 4 piston Calipers. I was really lucky to get this car given its condition and the Dukes of Hazzard wrecking so many gen 2 Chargers from LA. It was a one owner and had spent all it's time in Reseda, CA. It was totally rust free and had done just over 75,000 miles when I bought it in April 1989, complete with Californian registration to December and its original black and yellow ZUL 646 plates. I paid \$7500 AUD for it which was cheap. It was the right car but at the wrong time because back then, there was no money to restore it. So it waited until I took a redundancy package from Telecom Australia in 1992 when it got a paint job. I'd had several colours in my head for some time but the turquoise was always my favourite. I really liked it with the off white vinyl top on both 1970 VG VIPs and HQ and HZ Holden Statesmans. This combo accentuates the body lines and the light colour roof changes the perception of the overall shape. So I picked a modern pearl color from the Honda range (Ssshh don't tell anyone). This all adds up to my car being very individual here in Australia.





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At the time I also bought a 1969 factory 440 magnum & 727 which I had rebuilt. The engine was bored 30 thou and the block went through an acid bath and then got new everything! The heads and block were shaved to factory specs to give a genuine 10.25:1 compression and it was balanced. I could have done more but being a home owner, the house ate the spare cash and the car languished in the garage for years, a lot of years, 25 all up!

A few years into that period and \$6,000 later, I had it 95% converted to RHD but never got the expensive \$800 engineers report. Soon after the laws changed to allow LHD. Fortunately Paul Norris at Elko Performance (a local Mopar Guru) had a customer with a '69 Charger who wanted it converted to RHD, so we did the swap. The only down side is I now have a dash with no center A/C vents or padding.





Fast forward to 2013 and I could finally afford to move the project ahead a little and maybe get it mobile. During this time my mother passed away and I inherited some money so I took the opportunity to do even more. I upgraded most components to R/T specs including a 3.55:1 LSD and heavier than standard torsion bars for the 440 but I wanted it to drive more like a modern car. So I set about adding the 4 major items that make the most difference. After a reco job on the front brakes I had (No.1), rear discs added and upgraded to a (No.2) LHD power rack, sourced from the export GMH Commodore/Pontiac GTO. I also wanted more gears (No.3) and the best, most viable option was a Gear Vendor Overdrive/Underdrive unit. It has an automatic mode so it drives like a 4 speed and also a manual mode so you can effectively have a 6 speed by splitting all 3 gears. The ratio drop takes the 3.55:1 down to 2.77:1. I should have done the numbers and picked a better diff ratio to achieve a pseudo 4 speed. I now have a reco 4.3:1 LSD center to give a final drive of 3.35:1. It will be fitted as soon as I can get the Gear Vendor OD to behave and not lock on. So 3 out of 4 done, leaving only (No.4) EFI.

The engine also got some more mods and sorting out. The water pump and housing were replaced with high flow aluminum items and some Mopar Performance finned alloy rocker covers. I swapped the crazy Street Hemi Purple cam lumpy bump stick for the revised timing version in search of a better idle and actually got some vacuum for the brakes. Much to my disgust, I fitted a new 780 vac Holley because I couldn't find a local who understood my Edelbrock. I also fitted an Edelbrock Performer, twin plane intake and a very expensive exhaust system comprising TTI Extractors at over \$900 AUD, which

were then modified to get around the rack, then Jet Hot coated. Added a hand fabricated twin 2.5" Stainless Steel system complete with "x"pipe and Stainless Steel Mufflers thanks to Brad McKenzie at Elko Performance. The whole system cost somewhere around \$4.5K but at least it won't rust out from lack of use and hopefully it'll out last me!

The interior still has the original door cards, console and rear seat. The bucket covers are from Legendary Auto Interiors. The Dash has been restored and I've added a repro Tic Toc Tac, which of course doesn't work, and woodgrain facia from the SE but the gauges still need the faces restored. I've replaced the radio with a period correct looking but modern internals AM FM unit. My next job is to fit electric windows, I've managed to find repro '68 switches (which I prefer to '69) and also the hard to find retaining clips. I'll be using an Aussie "Chrysler by Chrysler" window wiring loom and FG Ford Falcon regulators with remote motors. This will give me space to fit the switches over the original winder holes.

It will be followed by removing the grille to repaint and fit repro chrome trim, it's a big job because the entire front has to be removed leaving only the guards, bonnet (sorry, hood) and headlights. I'm really not looking forward to that. Apart from the R/T badge, the grille is as it left the factory plus wear and tear. I searched without success for 15" by 10" wide mags with an even offset for the rear because everything available had a 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " dish. Eventually I bought the current wheels which are 15x7 and 15x8 Ridler 675 series with Mastercraft 235s & 295s to replace the "TA ice skates" I originally fitted. Fool!







Back to the performance. I trailered it up to Heathcote dragstrip (2 hour trip) a few years back for the Mopar Nationals to see what it could do. Unfortunately I found out the hard way that my small block car 5/16 inch fuel line was starving it at high revs and that all 440s came from the factory with 3/8 inch lines (traps for young players). I spoke to Matt Beale, a local Mopar mechanic at the time about his 440 Challenger (now doing 13.2 to 13.5) who had started with the same issue and similar times as me (a very poor 14.7). The line has now been upgraded and I also added an electric pump and regulator for the second attempt, but failed again in 39 degrees C or 102 F heat with fuel vaporizing restricting us to 14.1. Future plans include twin thermos fans and A/C to be hooked up again. I've since fitted Edelbrock RPM Performer Aluminum heads, which let it rev like a small block but it

exposed weak valve springs on the track the next year resulting in one bent pushrod and another punching through a rocker. OOPS! The latest addition has been a Holley Sniper EFI kit, the matching Sniper fuel tank and the dual sync Holley Hyper-spark ignition system. The car has been on a dyno and driven to Bendigo 100 miles away and back and since been to Chryslers on the Murray 200 miles away. It developed an annoying miss after refuelling that increased until the next tank. It improved with another tank and was OK by the time



I got home. The next day we were in COVID19 lockdown and I didn't start it for almost 9 weeks. Now it will not idle and feathering it at 2,500 rpm sees it die within about 30 seconds. Someday when the lockdown is lifted I might be able to get it sorted. So far I discovered 5 possible issues including the O2 sensor.

We don't quite know what the car can do in its current configuration, but we think about 13.2 ET and possibly high 12.s when the 4.3:1 rear end goes in. I've built a cruiser that is a bit of a Jekyll and Hyde that a friend tells me can get very angry very quickly. Elko Performance supplied most of the parts and a lot of advice. Valiant Spares and Repairs did most of the modifications and assembly. Thanks for reading my story

After reading Martin's story & checking the photos, I had to ask about the amber lights in the rear bumper. His response:

Well spotted. Not a lot of people notice because they blend in. The last cars in Australia to have brake light indicators were in 1958 so people no longer realize they're indicators any more. It was made law for all cars produced after 1958, but I believe enthusiast cars on limited registration are now allowed. I wanted to be safe but the lights had to look like they belong there. I've seen bolt on lights hanging off the bumper and one guy cut the outer section of the tail light lens to fit an amber piece which looked horrible. I also have amber front indicators but they're LED amber and white combination replacements so there is no visible change. Australian laws changed in 1973 to require front amber indicators but they didn't make either law retrospective so the old indicators slowly vanished by natural attrition. I also own a 1965 Signet which now has amber rear indicators. I've used a 60mm LED ring that fits under the lens and provides a halo around the reverse light. For your info, Chrysler Australia rewired the rear lights to combine indicators and reverse lights and then ran a separate new black wire for the brakes.
