

Missing Members Updates (cont)

Ed & Linda Sobiecki;

Thanks so much for your inquiry about us. Rest assured we have been devouring all the Inland Mopars newsletters, and all the assorted emails from club members, through our email server. Thankfully, it does help us keep us to date with what is going on. It has been a rather lackluster experience here at the Sobiecki household since last March, when everything really came to a standstill.

I was just beginning to do some consulting with the Upland Unified School District in March, when the schools were closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. I was 2/3 of the way through an assessment of a student, when we had to stop. Fortunately, I was able to salvage enough information from my partial assessment that, along with previous assessment data, I could put together a report so that the student's special education placement could be properly continued. Shortly after this I visited my doctor for a regular check-up. I asked him about continuing my consulting, and he strongly recommended that I discontinue such activity for about a year, or until a cure/vaccine for COVID-19 could be developed. This is because an assessment requires an encounter between the psychologist and a student for an extended period of time in close proximity. So much for my return to the work force. I am heartened by the recent news that a vaccine will soon be available, so this will allow me to get back to doing assessments (and making some great extra bucks for those car projects awaiting) as I had hoped to do earlier this year. The school district is anxiously awaiting my return, or so they tell me.

We have some animal news that has transpired since you folks last saw us. One of our two Lhasa Apsos, Wooster, has undergone ophthalmic surgery. He had become virtually blinded by cataracts, and was having considerable difficulty getting around inside, and especially outside, the home. We took him to a veterinary ophthalmic surgeon, and she was able to save his vision (partially) in his right eye, but not his left. However, partial vision in one eye is significantly better than total blindness. Wooster is getting around quite well since the surgery. His close-up vision isn't quite as good as it was before the cataracts, but he manages to sniff out his favorite foods and snacks, and knows his environment (inside and out) like the back of his paw. It's amazing what they can do these days for your pets.

We really miss all the Inland Mopars gang, especially the talks before and after the meetings with other members. You are right, Ken, those talks really give you a chance to catch up with others about what's going on in their lives, not just about what's happening with the cars. Oh yeah, before I digress (You knew that was coming).......the car.

Well, I think at this point I have pretty much sorted out any little glitches with the 1970 Challenger. After I made a few adjustments to the carburetor, it runs really nicely now, and doesn't bog or stall like it had been. Apparently, because we live in a somewhat hilly area, there are lots of places when you come to a stop the car is in an inclined (or declined) position. While this doesn't affect our fuel injected cars (which aren't affected by floats in a carburetor bowl), it can really play havoc with a carburetor. Before I took the plunge (\$\$\$) for a fuel injection system for the engine, I thought I'd fiddle with the carb a bit and see if that worked. It did. The engine idles at a little higher rpm, but that seems to prevent stalling considerably. Of course, my brilliant clutch work probably has a lot to do with it, too (yeah, right).




The toy Drive booth received about 30 toy donations. We also received \$800.00 in cash donations. These were taken to the storage unit along with toys Norma had previously purchased.




